### Consignment Information

- Entry nomination fee is \$100 per lot which must accompany nomination application. The fee is non-refundable and will be applied to sale expenses.
- Consignor must be a current member of the Texas Shorthorn Association or the Texas Junior Shorthorn Association or join with the consignment.
- Sale expense will be charged for each cataloged lot, regardless if scratched from the sale (substitutions may be made upon authorization by sale committee).
- Consignor settlement will be made after all payments have been completed.

### Cattle Information

- The sale will be for Shorthorn and/or ShorthornPlus bulls, females, cow/calf pairs, bred females, semen and embryos. All cattle must have an American Shorthorn Association certificate of registration.

- Limit of 1 bull per consignor and must CONSIGN a female. Upon approval of the sale committee embryo and pregnancy lots may be accepted as female. Maximum age of females is 8 years and maximum age of bulls is 6 years.
- All cattle must have current health papers acceptable for transfer out of state. Health papers must have **tattoo** numbers on the papers. All animals over 6 months must be tested for TH, PHA and DS or be free by pedigree. Health papers are checked by the state.
- Bulls must be certified as a virgin bull or be tested for trichomoniasis. ALL BULLS MUST BE TH NEGATIVE.
- All bred females must have due date and sire of calf and necessary paperwork for the registration of unborn calf.
- Cattle may be penned or haltered, but must have a docile nature.
- Consignor is responsible for feed and hay of own cattle. Water will be available.
- All cattle will be run through the chute for tattoo inspection (registration and calf hood) and tagging. The Texas Shorthorn Association is not responsible for accident or injury during this process
- All females 4 months and older must be calf hood vaccinated prior to the sale. If from a Certified Herd, please note as such in footnotes so it will be printed in the catalog.
- All cattle MUST be in good flesh condition prior to arriving at the sale. Must have an overall good visual appearance: hooves trimmed or in good shape and hair sale clipped.
- Consignor encouraged to have good picture of animals for catalog. Professional not required but a good picture will sell your cattle better.
- Bred females should be pregnancy checked and service age bulls have semen checked prior to sale by your local veterinarian. This information MUST be recorded on health certificate.
  
- Sale Committee and Sale Management will be responsible for setting sale order after all cattle have arrived and been inspected. They reserve the right to sift unfit cattle.**

**\*\*Private Treaty Steer Sale will be allowed. Steers will not go through the sale ring.\*\***
